

**Dual Enrollment for High School Students**

The Board approves the concept of dual enrollment wherein eligible high school students may enroll in a college level course, earn college credit, and simultaneously earn high school credit. The credit would be an elective credit, not a graduation requirement. A student may request that the principal consider the credit to fulfill a graduate requirement.

The following guidelines apply.

Students must be juniors or seniors.

Students must have an overall B average in all course work at the high school level.

Students applying for a college level course must have satisfied all course prerequisites.

Students seeking to dual enroll must have prior approval of the principal or Career and Technical Director.

Students in dual enrollment courses must maintain a B average in high school courses with no grade lower than a C; and must earn a grade of C or better in the college level course in order for it to count toward high school credit.

Students interested in the dual enrollment program must interview with the college instructor and/or admissions officer and be accepted prior to registration for the course.

The college or post secondary institution must have space available in the class.

Students participating in this program must be enrolled in at least six courses, including the dual enrollment course, unless the student has been accepted for an early admission program and is taking a full college load.

Tuition is the students responsibility unless the Superintendent and Board agree to pay for part or all of the costs.

The Superintendent will report annually to the School Board regarding the status of this program.
